Aviation Sustainability

AAPA Commits to Net Zero Emissions by 2050

- AAPA airlines are committed to net zero emissions reduction by 2050 and the industry's mid-term target of carbon neutral growth from 2020
- The long-term goal is highly dependent on contributions from all stakeholders: Governments, Airports, ANSP, Manufacturers, FIN Sector, Fuel Suppliers
- Pathway based on 4 Pillars for emissions reductions to underline commitment:
 - Fuel efficiency improvements through technology enhancement
 - **Operations and infrastructure initiatives**
 - Promoting commercialisation of sustainable aviation fuels (SAF)
 - Market-based measures: CORSIA (offsetting scheme in international aviation)



Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF)

- SAF critical part of industry strategy
- Support to commercialize SAF & ensure adequate cost-effective supply
- Government and stakeholder support with:
 - Subsidies and R&D
 - Resources for Feedstock & Facilities
 - Development of Production & Supply Chain
- Asia Pacific requires 40% of global SAF requirement
- Lack of SAF investment & facilities in A-Pac




Plus Measures to Bolster Efforts

- Invest in new technologies: direct carbon capture and sequestration
- Apply CORSIA, single global measure for international aviation
- Work with ICAO and Member States to forge and sustain global consensus on long-term goal
- In keeping with ICAO Principles & Agreements



Sustainability Road Map for Commitment





One Example of a Gradual Risk-Assessed Restart


- **1** Inter-Government Consensus to Streamline, Smooth & Simplify:
- Digital Travel Pass, Digital Credentials, Digital Certificates
- Protocols, Policies & Framework for Recovery Plan
- 2 when vv% fully vaccinated:
- Quarantine-free travel for vaccinated residents
- To destinations with vaccine-immunity (ww% fully vaccinated)
- 3 when xx% fully vaccinated:
- Quarantine-free travel for vaccinated visitors (by vaccination or recovery)
- From places with vaccine-immunity (yy% fully vaccinated)
- 4 when zz% fully vaccinated:
- Quarantine-free travel
- Between places with High Immunity (zz% fully vaccinated)


Asia Pacific International Air Passenger & Cargo Demand



- During the first seven months of the year, international passenger demand averaged 4% of volumes recorded in the corresponding period in 2019
- By contrast, international cargo demand has recovered to pre-pandemic volumes



International passenger traffic by region



More than a year into the pandemic, international passenger traffic of Asia Pacific carriers remain in stasis

Note: In June 2021, international RPKs of carriers based in Africa was 27% of the corresponding month of 2019. July data not available.
